### *South Carolina Baptist Congress of Christian Education*



Dr. Toney C. Parks is a native of Birmingham, Alabama. He is a 1980 Criminal Justice graduate of the University of South Carolina. He received a Masters Divinity degree from Erskine College and Theological Seminary, and earned a Doctorate degree, in counseling from Westminster Theological Seminary. Dr. Parks has served and participated in the Oxford England Round-Table on the subject of “Race I America.” Dr. Parks is an Assistant Professor of Biblical Counseling and Practical Theology at Erskine Theological Seminary.

Dr. Parks is very active in the community. His responsibilities consist of the following: President of the South Carolina Congress of Christian Education, 1st Vice Moderator of the Enoree River Baptist Association. He has served as a Governor appointed Commissioner for the State of South Carolina. He serves as Chaplain of the Greenville City Police

Department, and is the President and Co-founder of Family Outreach Community Services in Greenville South Carolina. He has served as Co-Host of the 107.3 Vital Link morning radio show dealing with community issues relating to the family. Dr. Parks has also served as consultant to Senator Ralph Anderson “Organized Gang Task Force.”

Dr. Parks is a training facilitator throughout the state and nation in the subject of marriage from a Christian Prospective. He is a facilitator for the South Carolina Fatherhood Coalition.

Dr. Parks has spoken before the South Carolina Senate in Defense of the Marriage Protection Amendment, which passed overwhelmingly. In additional to his facilitation of workshops and seminars, Dr. Parks is a state and national instructor on the subject of Church Leadership, Administration and Polity for the South Carolina Education and Missionary Convention; and the National Baptist Convention of America, USA.

Dr. Parks has served as Sr. Pastor of the Mt. Sinai Missionary Baptist Church for the past 24 years. Being the Pastor of Mt. Sinai Baptist Church has been one of the greatest and rewarding challenges of His ministerial journey. Pastor Leonard O. Griffin is the youngest son of eight (8) children born to Alma and the late Glasglow S. Griffin, Sr. of Edgefield, South Carolina. He is a May 1999 graduate, with a Bachelor of Arts in Pastoral Ministry and a Minor in Religious Education, from Morris College, Sumter, South Carolina ranking third (3rd) in a class of 186. He is an honors graduate of Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School (CRCDS), Rochester, New York earning the Master of Divinity in May of 2002. He is a veteran of the U.S. Navy and the U.S. Navy Reserves.

He and his wife, Wandalyn Kenner Griffin, have been married since 1991. They are the proud parents of three (3): Samuel DeLeon (deceased), Kandy JaNay and Kemuel James-Owen Griffin. Pastor Griffin entered ministry in January 1992 and preached his first sermon at Mount Calvary Missionary Baptist Church, Johnston, South Carolina. This event was an answering to a call from God that he now realizes was initiated when he was nine years old! The Simmon Ridge Samaritan Baptist Association, Edgefield, South Carolina in 1993, ordained him.

He has served as Pastor of the Fairmount (Williston, SC) and Zion Field Missionary Baptist Churches, (Aiken, SC), the Southern Missionary Baptist Church, Syracuse, NY, 2002 - 2005 and as Senior Pastor since 2005 of the historic Morris Street Baptist Church in Charleston, SC. Since becoming the Pastor of Morris Street, the Pastor has given leadership to a thirty-five member Strategic Planning Committee and completed a strategic plan, which the congregation adopted for implementation, for the future of this 146 year-old congregation! Over 25 ministries have been created or revitalized under this plan. Notable among the ministries created is the church's partnership with Burke Middle High School named "The Social Butterflies". This community outreach to "at-risk" 12-14 year-old girls seeks to increase the participants' sense of self-worth, perspective toward education, and to develop and define short and long term goals. The ultimate purpose is to help them become self-sufficient, motivated adults!

Pastor Griffin is a subscribing Life Member of the NAACP, Charleston Branch and has volunteered services with Low Country AIDS Services, a division of the Charleston County Health Department. He has served as "Principal for a Day" at Hursey Elementary School and at Susan G. Boykin Academy of Performing Arts, North Charleston, SC. He graduated from The Diversity Leadership Academy, the educational division of The American Institute for Managing Diversity. Their purpose is "to equip leaders from various community sectors with the leadership skills and competencies to effectively manage diversity".

In 2008, he received the Community Award in Religion from the MOJA Festival for his efforts to improve the Charleston community. From 2009-2012, he served on the Advisory Board of the Charleston Trident Urban League. He also has served as Co-Chair of the YWCA Tri-County Martin Luther King Jr. Ecumenical Worship Services for four years.

Christian Education is a hallmark of his ministry. Pastor Griffin currently serves as the Director of the Morris College, Charleston Extension Certificate Class, educating aspiring Lay Leaders, and licensed and ordained ministers. He also serves as an instructor with the Charleston County Baptist Sunday School Congress and the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education. Additionally, he is the Assistant Dean of the SC Baptist Congress of Christian Education and General Secretary of the Charleston County Missionary Baptist Association. Pastor Griffin remains in high demand as an evangelist, lecturer, and Christian Education consultant

Under Pastor Moore's leadership the church instituted the Preaching/Teaching format during revival, the Mini Congress/Revival, Saturday Morning Bible Study, Children's Church, and an accredited Bible Academy.

Good Shepherd, with the dynamic and visionary leadership of Rev. Moore, is active in local, state, and national Christian growth activities. Pastor Moore's past and current affiliations include Secretary, Augusta Baptist Ministers' Conference (1984 - 1986); Chairman, Budget Committee, General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia (1984 - 2004); 1st Vice President of the 10th District (1987 - 1994) and President (1994 - 2004); Clergy Staff, Augusta University Hospital Executive Board (1989 - 1991); Assistant Treasurer, State Congress of Christian Education (1989 - 2003); Treasurer, State Congress of Christian Education (2003 - 2004); Chairman, Family Committee, Local Coordination Council (1990 -1995); President, Augusta Baptist Ministers' Conference (1992 - 1994); and Co-Chairman, Augustans Together (1992 - 1996); President, General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc. (2004 -2012); Appointed Vice President, Southern Region of the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc (Sept. 2009).

# Rev. Dr. Charles E. Booth

## Banquet Speaker



Preaching the Gospel is a life calling for the Reverend Dr. Charles E. Booth. He is the Senior Pastor of the Mt. Olivet Baptist Church and fully affiliated Professor of Preaching at the Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio. Education, particularly Christian education, also is a very high priority for this pastor. Dr. Booth has traveled the world preaching and teaching the Gospel. He has also preached on college, university, and seminary campuses throughout this country.

Dr. Booth earned his Bachelor of Arts degree at Howard University and his Master of Divinity degree from Eastern Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He earned the Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio where he serves as a member of the Board of Trustees.

Dr. Charles E. Booth is an author, publishing his book, Bridging the Breach: Evangelical Thought and Liberation in the African-American Preaching Tradition (Urban Ministries) in 2000. The Prophetic Voice: Words for Today was released in 2011. His most recent publication, released in 2014 - Stronger in my Broken Places; Claiming a Life of Fullness in God.

Dr. Booth is a former member of the advisory board of *The African American Pulpit* and has contributed writings in multiple publications, such as *From One Brother to Another: Voices of African American Men*; *The Irresistible Urge to Preach: A Collectible of African American "Call" Stories*; *Outstanding Black Sermons, volumes III and IV*; and *Wisdom of the Ages: The Mystique of the African American Preacher*. Dr. Booth's biography and a sermon appear in Preaching with Sacred Fire: An Anthology of African-American Sermons, 1750-Present.

The Baltimore native has devoted the past 40 years to Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, where he has overseen substantial church growth. In 1993, Dr. Booth founded the Mount Olivet Christian Academy, later renamed the Gloria S. Friend Christian Academy in honor of its first administrator. The Academy, which has grades kindergarten through sixth, stresses excellence in academics, Christian education, and African and African American history. It is fully accredited by the Ohio Department of Education. During Dr. Booth's tenure, Mt. Olivet raised \$2.1 million to build the 100-seat Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Chapel, an administrative wing and 12 classrooms, and to expand the fellowship center, along with other facility improvements. Mt. Olivet is now in the planning stages of building an \$8 million Family Life Center. Dr. Booth leads his congregation by focusing on providing spiritual nurturing and information. "The pulpit is no place for personal opinion," he said to attendees of the African American Leadership Workshop in 2007. "The pulpit is the place for propagation of the Gospel."

Dr. Booth has been a guest preacher to enlisted service men and women and their families in Germany; the North American preacher at the Baptist World Youth Conference in Buenos Aires, Argentina; and a guest revivalist and preacher at churches and conferences throughout the United States, Europe, South America, Central America and Africa. He has been the guest preacher and lecturer at the historic Hampton Ministers' Conference in 1984, 1995 and 1999.

Dr. Booth has been listed in *Who's Who Among African Americans* and in *Ebony* magazine's Honor Roll of Preachers. He received the 1999 James E. Stamps Alumni Recognition Award for outstanding contributions to young people attending historically black colleges and universities; the 1999 Alpha Phi Alpha and the Alpha Lambda Rho Chapter's Vertner Woodson Tandy Award for dedicated community service. The Columbus Ohio Education Association awarded the 2014 Martin Luther King, Jr. Humanitarian Award to Dr. Booth for his documented commitment to local and global communities around the issues of unemployment, homelessness, education, and health.

He has also earned his Doctorate of Ministry degree at McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago, Illinois. In addition to his studies at CRCDS and McCormick Theological Seminary, Reverend Graham studied abroad at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, Israel, which afforded him the opportunity to travel extensively throughout the Holy Land.

Reverend Graham has served as pastor of the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church of Darlington S.C. and is currently pastor of Saint John Baptist Church in Columbia, South Carolina. Under his leadership at Saint John Baptist Church, the surrounding community is being helped through the Food Pantry and Benevolence Ministry. On Christmas Eve, Saint John Baptist Church reaches out to the homeless/hopefuls and needy in the community with a dinner meal at the church. Over 800 persons from agencies and facilities that serve the homeless are in attendance.

He currently serves as the Moderator of the Gethsemane Missionary Baptist Association and is currently serving as a Regional Vice-President for The Baptist Education and Missionary Convention of South Carolina. Reverend Graham has served on University of South Carolina Project Impact and on the Advisory Board of Project F.A.I.T.H (Fostering AIDS Initiatives That Heal) which is a state-wide demonstration project of the South Carolina HIV/AIDS Council (SCHAC) designed to empower and build the capacity of churches and other faith-based entities to create local solutions to local problems. The initiative included the provision of funding for thirty-four churches within the state of South Carolina. Reverend Graham has also served on the Advisory Board of South Carolina Community Bank.

He is married to the former Ms. Yvette Dukes of Kingstree, South Carolina, who is a third grade teacher at Polo Elementary School. Together they have three children, Jamey O'Neal Graham, Jr., Jayda Orin Graham and Jasmyn Olivia Graham.

Rev. Ezell graduated from Peach County High School in Fort Valley, Georgia. Rev. Ezell was voted Man of the Year for his contributions in the Fort Valley Community. Rev. Ezell was also co-founder of the Peach County Progress (the first historical black newspaper in Fort Valley, Georgia).

He graduated from Fort Valley State University with a Bachelor's Degree of Art in Criminology with a Minor in English Journalism. While at Fort Valley State University, he received the Ty Cobb Scholarship Award and the Thermostat Award for having the highest academic average in Criminology. After graduation, he received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Fort Valley State University for contributions in the field of Criminology.
